Private Henry Hollowood 10th Battalion, King's Shropshire Light Infantry

He was born between April and June 1884 at Ash, the son of John and Mary.

In 1911 he was living and working at Grove Farm, Ash Parva as a Farm worker.

He married Elizabeth Cooke of Ash between January and March 1914. They had 3 children, Thomas 1914, Elizabeth 1916 and John H 1918.

He enlisted at Whitchurch into KSLI Army No. 203591 and was transferred to The Welsh Regiment, No. 285191 and then back to KSLI No. 29788.

He was awarded the British War and Victory medals.

His widow was granted a War Gratuity of £7/-/-d and was refunded the sum of £16/9/3d "for widow and children" in his pay account. She proved his will in 1919 when she was living at 34 Ash Parva. His effects were valued at £116/17/2d.
