

Corporal Percy Leonard Hall 199 Coy. Machine Gun Corps

- He was born between October and December 1895, the son of George and Emily.
- In 1911 he was living with his parents at 5 Churton's Yard Whitchurch and working as an errand boy
- He enlisted at Whitchurch into The Royal Field Artillery and was allocated the Army number 142379. He subsequently transferred to the Machine Gun Corps.
- He was killed in action on 10 October 1917 and is remembered on the Tyne Cot Memorial and Ash War Memorial.
- He was awarded the British War and Victory Medals.
- His father was granted a War Gratuity of £7/-/-d. and refunded the sum of £2/8/5d in his pay account.
