COVID 19

Conditions of Use

- *the capacity for safe use of the Village Hall is circa 12 persons at 2m distance (+/- 3 depending upon the event)*
- *we ask all our visitors to respect the current guidelines on social distancing to reduce the risk of spread of CV19 and follow the signs in the Hall including washing your hands for at least 20 seconds or sanitising on entering the Hall*
- *face coverings are required in indoor venues, subject to exceptions for health reasons or venues for eating or drinking.*
- *From 17th May the “rule of 6” is to be observed – this means you may enter the building as a group of no more than 6 persons (subject to certain exceptions including if your group are all members of not more than two households¹ or a support bubble²); once seated persons from one group may not move to another group, this is known as “mingling” which from the 17th May until further notice is unlawful*
- *You are required to provide your name and contact details for NHS test, track & trace purposes*
- *Hirers & groups using the Hall are required to carry out their own risk assessment which will comply with those of the Village Hall*
- *Hygiene in the Hall - anyone using the Hall is required to clean any surfaces which have been touched before they leave*
- *Snooker groups are restricted to no more than 6 in the Hall at any one time and otherwise attend following EPSB English Snooker Guidelines, Hygiene in the Hall and sign in for track and trace purposes*
- *Art & craft classes, fitness and other classes are restricted to no more than 8 attendees plus one group leader who will be responsible for monitoring social distancing, Hygiene in the Hall and track and trace details*
- *We ask anyone attending classes or events to wear a face covering when moving around the building. If eating or drinking and for your health and well-being face coverings may be removed once seated.*
- *When attending snooker or classes please bring your own equipment and avoid sharing it with others.*

¹ A household includes persons living together under one roof as a family unit whether related or not, and all those including carers living together in children’s homes, residential schools and colleges

² A support bubble is a single adult household which is linked with one other household in a close support network
